

NEW PLANTS FOR 2019

Perennials

Aster laevis (Smooth Blue Aster) *Native*

Profusion of lavender-blue flowers in August well into fall. Attracts butterflies and pollinators. Sun. Well-drained soil.

Ht. 2-3 ft. Spread 2-4 ft. Zone 4-8



Aster macrophyllus 'Twilight' (Big Leaf Aster) *Native Selection*

Stems develop a red-purple color and bear sessile leaves and large lavender-blue daisy flowers from August well into October. Pollinator plant and host for butterflies and moths. Mildew resistant. Morning sun or dappled shade.

Ht. 30-36 inches. Spread 1-1.5 ft. Zone 3-8



Dalea purpurea (Purple Prairie Clover) *Native*

Purple flowers with golden flecks on cone like heads on upright wiry stems from June-August. A nitrogen-fixing plant, great for prairie restoration. Garden uses: rock gardens, borders and naturalized areas. Sun, well drained soils.

Ht. 1-3 ft. Spread 1-2 ft. Zone 3-8



Echinacea purpurea 'Mellow Yellows' *Native Selection*

Intro from Jelitto that ranges from light yellow to the deepest golden, with bright orange centers. Sturdy and reliable plant, good cut flower. Great source of nectar and seed for pollinators and wildlife. Sun.

Ht. 24-30 inches. Spread 12-24 inches. Zone 4-8



Epimedium x 'Domino' (Barrenwort)

Burgundy arching spikes of large white flowers with maroon flower tips in April and May. Spiny edged green leaves mottled with burgundy. Very floriferous. Deer and rabbit resistant. Pt. shade/shade.

Ht. 18-24 inches, with flower. Spread 24-30 inches. Zone 5-8



Eupatorium dubium (Joe Pye Weed) Native

A compact version of the popular Joe Pye Weed grows only 2-4 feet tall. More appropriate for small gardens. Same color as 'Gateway', native to the Eastern U.S. Attracts butterflies, songbirds, pollinators. Sun/Pt. Shade.

Ht. 2-4 ft. Spread 2-2.5 ft. Zone 4-8



Helianthus angustifolius (Swamp Sunflower) Native

Bright green glossy, golden daisy flowers attract drifts of butterflies. Golden brown seed clusters feed birds in the winter. Blooms September until frost. Can grow up to 6 feet or taller in sunny/partly sunny, moist sites.

Ht. 3-6+ ft. Spread 4-6 ft. Zone 5-9



Heuchera villosa 'Mega Caramel' (USPPAF) Native Selection

Huge caramel foliage with pink/purple underside. Almost twice as large as 'Caramel'. A hybrid of H. villosa, an Eastern US native. Thrives in heat and humidity. White flowers in late summer. Pt. Shade/Shade.

Ht. 20-24 inches. Spread 20-28 inches. Zone 5-9



Heuchera x 'Guacamole' (PP28463) Native Selection

Lime green Heuchera on steroids! Brig, bright chartreuse green leaves form a 22 x 28 inch mound. Tiny white flowers on slender spikes in mid-summer. Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies. Best in part shade/shade, moist, well-drained soil.

Ht. 24-28 inches. Spread 30-36 inches. Zone 4-9



Lysimachia lanceolata* var. *purpurea* (Lance-leaved Loosestrife) *Native

Slender, upright native perennial wildflower. Yellow, starry nodding flowers from late spring/early fall. Wine red, lance-leaf foliage. Great groundcover, pollinator plant.

Sun/part sun.

Ht. 1-3 ft. Spread 1-2 ft. Zone 4-8



Phlox paniculata* 'Peacock White' *Native Selection

Clear white fragrant flowers in late spring, early summer. Some of the same great qualities as *Phlox* p. 'David' but with a richer fragrance and brighter white flowers.

Disease resistant, drought tolerant. Sun.

Ht. 18-24 inches. Spread 12-18 inches. Zone 4-8



Phlox subulata* 'Crimson Beauty' (Moss Phlox) *Native Selection

Low-growing evergreen moss-like foliage, covered with fragrant rosy-red flowers in mid-late Spring. Best in poor, sandy soil. Sun.

Ht. 4 inches. Spread 12-18 inches. Zone 5-9



Rudbeckia triloba* 'Black Jack Gold' (Brown-eyed Susan) *Native Selection

Round daisy-like golden flowers with black cone in July-October. Compact, well branched flowering stalks, sturdy and long-lived strain. Valuable late bloomer.

Deer resistant. Biennial. Sun.

Ht. 3 ft. Spread 18 inches. Zone 3-8



***Sedum SunSparkler* 'Dazzleberry' (PP22457)**

Selected for the compact growth habit, blue-grey leaves and large, brilliant pink flower heads from late summer into early autumn. Well drained soils. Sun.

Ht. 6-8 inches. Spread 18 inches. Zone 4-9



Sedum SunSparkler 'Firecracker' (PP26595)

Selected for the unique foliage/flower combination. Burgundy-red foliage and vibrant pink flower clusters in summer well into fall. Low maintenance, spreading, full groundcover. Well drained soils. Sun.

Ht. 6-8 inches. Spread 18 inches. Zone 4-9



Grasses

Acorus americanus (American Sweet Flag) *Native*

Hardy perennial swamp and bog plant with spicy-scented leaves. Produces spadix like flowers in June/July, followed by dark berries. Spreads by rhizomes. Great for stabilizing pond edges or boggy areas. Sun/pt. shade.

Ht. 2-3 ft. Spread 18-24 inches. Zone 3-6



Carex appalachica (Appalachian Sedge) *Native*

Very fine, hair-like foliage in a neat, fountain shaped clump. Spreads slowly by rhizomes to form a tidy dry shade groundcover. Low-maintenance lawn substitute. Best in Part shade. Will tolerate sun.

Ht. 6-8 inches. Spread 12-18 inches. Zone 3-7



Deschampsia caespitosa 'Goldtau' (Gold Dew Tufted Hair Grass) *Native Selection*

Cool season clump forming grass thrives in partly sunny moist sites. Smaller more compact and longer bloom period than species. Narrow green leaves and airy chartreuse, yellow florets in summer. Sun/Pt. Shade.

Ht. 1-2 ft. Spread 2 ft. Zone 3-8
